



Highlights

San Diego County Ecosystems Assessment

Under the umbrella of the Alliance, a

team of ecologists and climatologists came together to review the most current regionally specific information on natural resources and local species in the context of climate change. Their findings will be included in California's Fourth Climate Change Assessment.

2017 Southwestern Tribal Climate Change Summit

The Alliance partnered with the La Jolla Band of Luiseño Indians, the University of San Diego, and the Institute of Tribal Environmental Professionals to bring together 190 tribal members, environmental professionals, and researchers to discuss climate change impacts and solutions for Southwestern tribes.

Batiquitos Lagoon Resiliency Plan (BLRP)

The Alliance is supporting a stakeholder driven scenario planning effort to build climate resiliency at the Batiquitos Lagoon Ecological Reserve.

Traveling Trunks

Climate Kids lesson plans, materials, and other resources are now available for educators to teach climate science through NGSS aligned curriculum using hands on science, storytelling, and art.

Art of Change Exhibit

The Alliance created a traveling art exhibit featuring climate inspired artwork created by local children and artists to engage the public on climate science. Find a location near you!

2017 Balboa Park Earth Fair

The Alliance and The Resilient Coastlines Project of Greater San Diego hosted the 1st ever climate science area at Balboa Park Earth Fair for 60,000 attendees. Partner organizations, musicians and artists made this a fun and interactive event.
